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The Provost's Award for Innovative Teaching in General Education

Purpose

The Provost's Award for Innovative Teaching in General Education recognizes excellence in general education course development or/and teaching. There is one award each year. The winner receives a certificate and a monetary award. The amount will be determined by funding available through the Center for Excellence in Teaching.

Nomination

Candidates may be nominated by students, faculty members, chairs, coordinators or deans. Candidates must submit supporting information and teaching documentation. All completed nominations and supporting documents must be returned to the Office of Provost, Suite 9, Tingley Hall by April 15th.

Eligibility

The Provost's Award for Innovative Teaching in General Education is open to all full-time university faculty (includes instructors). Faculty members who have taught at least one course approved for general education during the previous calendar year (over the period April 1,

- Testimonials and/or letters of support from past or current students, alumni or colleagues
- Any other documents or materials having direct bearing on the nominees achievements

Selection

All nominations are reviewed and screened by the Faculty Awards Selection Committee. Each of the criteria based on performance and depth of information pertaining to the nominee is ranked by the committee. The committee recommends to the Vice Provost the nominees whose performance, based on written recommendation, best exemplifies the criteria set forth by the award category.

Notification

The winner will be recognized at the annual Awards and Recognition luncheon in May.

The award recipient will be presented a framed certificate and a monetary award.
